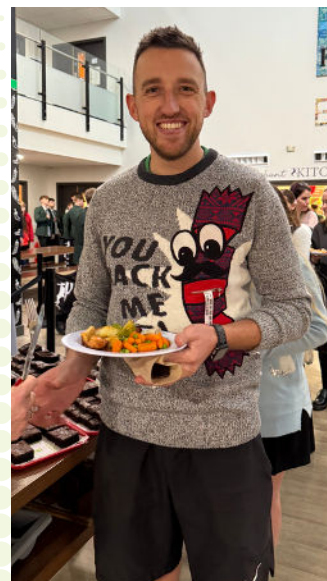

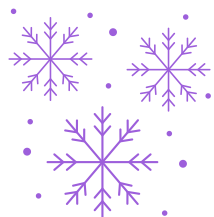

» A Festive Message from Mr Chapman – Head of Franklin House

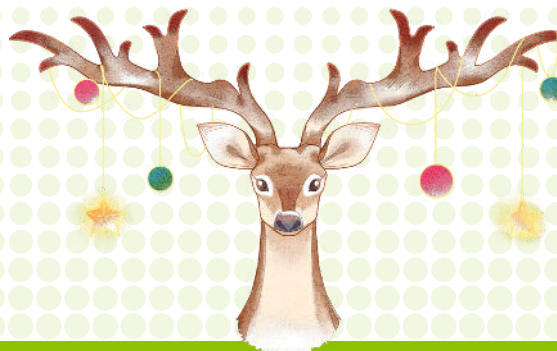
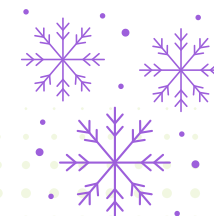

Aerospace engineers research, design, and build aircraft like planes, spacecraft, and satellites.

Tasks

- developing navigation, communications, or weapons systems
- researching ways to make fuel-efficient parts
- testing prototypes
- collecting and analysing test data
- planning and supervising the fitting of aircraft and components
- signing off projects under strict industry regulations
- scheduling and supervising maintenance

Skills Required

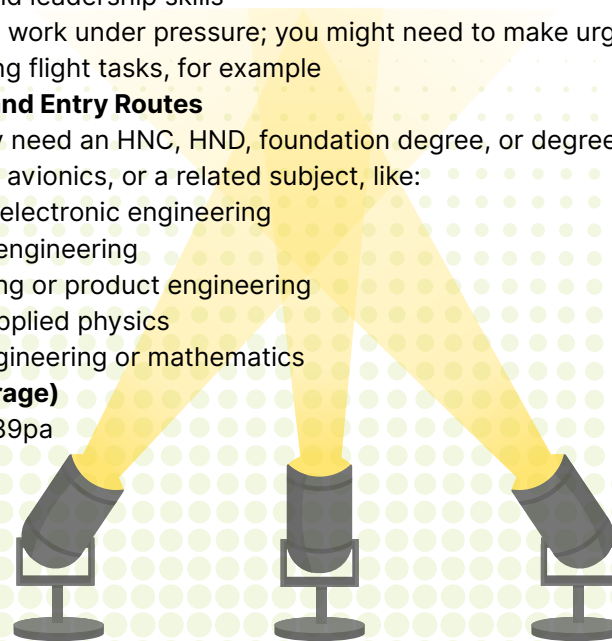
- problem solving skills
- technical skills, including computer aided design or manufacturing
- teamwork and leadership skills
- the ability to work under pressure; you might need to make urgent fixes to aircraft during flight tasks, for example

- electrical or electronic engineering
- mechanical engineering
- manufacturing or product engineering
- physics or applied physics
