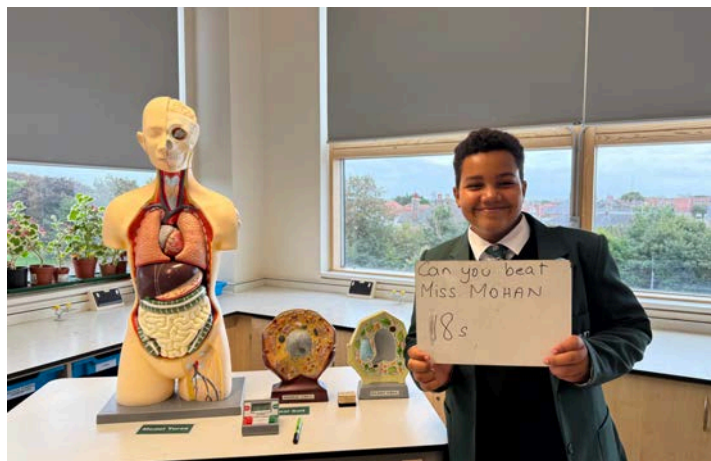




» Open Events

This term has seen some significant changes in our SEN department to ensure that the spaces we use for supporting our students on the SEN register are the best they can be.

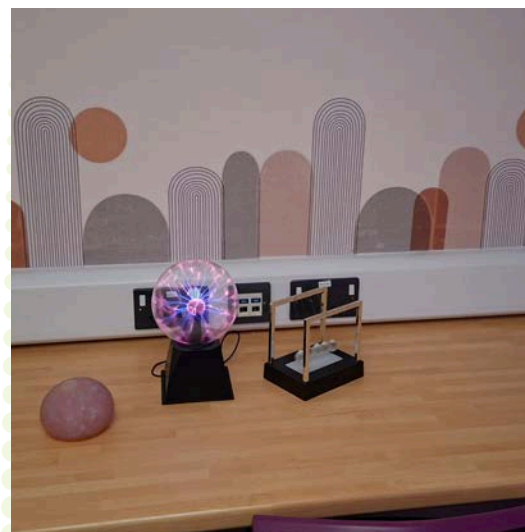
We no longer use F01s as a SEN space and instead have a number of purposeful spaces to deliver interventions and support students' emotional needs.

The Den is our new re-regulation calming space that students on the SEN

register are invited to use when feeling overwhelmed and/or overstimulated to be supported in re-regulating and then returning to lessons.

The Pods are new intervention spaces in the library that are used for 1:1 or small group interventions.

We have also developed our supported start to the day in the library. For students that find our morning welcome or the tutor programme overwhelming they instead use the library to receive a

» The 100% Club

This term we launched the 100% club. This is an initiative that runs every month to celebrate students with 100% attendance that month. At the end of September we had around 480 students who had attended school every day possible in September. They received a certificate from their tutor and an extra 5 minutes break and lunch time for one day as a celebration of their hard work. After half term we will identify those students that attended every day possible in October and celebrate their membership of the October 100% club.



» Reconnect

How can Reconnect help students?

-  Offering personalised targets around Learning, Social Skills and Emotional Wellbeing to support and gauge progress.
-  Providing a smaller, supportive setting with high staff-to-student ratios.
-  Building positive relationships with trusted staff.
-  Supporting emotional wellbeing through the Strengthening Minds programme.
-  Encouraging physical activity through engaging PE lessons.
-  Helping with organisation, equipment and uniform.

What does a day in Reconnect look like?

	Activity
2.00pm-2.35pm	Food offered in the Atrium, wellbeing check-in, uniform and equipment support, PSHE.
2.35pm-3.30pm	English/Maths lesson taught by subject teachers.
3.30pm-4.15pm	Strengthening Minds programme focusing on wellbeing and resilience for success in the classroom and general life.
4.15pm-5.00pm	Tailored PE lesson developing communication, interaction, and teamwork skills.

What is Reconnect?

Reconnect is a term long Alternative Provision (AP) placement within the mainstream school. It is designed to provide students with targeted support in a smaller, structured environment before transitioning back into their mainstream lessons. The aim is to help students re-engage with learning, build confidence, and develop the skills they need to succeed.



What is an Alternative Provision in mainstream school?

Alternative Provision in a mainstream setting means that students remain part of their school community while accessing a smaller, supportive classroom environment (Reconnect) for their learning. The focus is on meeting individual needs (academic, social, emotional, or behavioural) while preparing for a smooth reintegration into regular lessons. This allows students to develop the necessary skills they need to succeed in mainstream school, in a smaller nurturing environment.



» Attendance

This term Mr Carter spoke to all students about the importance of good attendance at school. We identified that missing only 10 days of school in an academic year is likely to have a noticeable impact on academic outcomes at the end of year 11.
